Club Championship

The centre fire element of the club championship was shot on the 5 October.

The weather was kind with sunshine and very little wind.

The competition is in three practices, shot at the 200 point with the target being five black roundels.



The roundels are 70mm across with scoring rings of ten down to five. The ten ring is only 10mm in diameter so competitors need to shoot 0.2 MOA to consistently be in the ten ring.

Practice 1 is two sighters plus ten shots to count with no time limit. Two shots on each roundel.

Practice 2 is ten rounds in 45 seconds. Two shots on each roundel.

Practice 3 is one shot on each of ten 3 second exposures with a gap of 5 to 10 seconds away time. Two shots on each roundel.

As in all past Championship shoots nobody succeeded in getting all of their shots scoring but then the timings are meant to stop that anyway!



Nigel was shooting for the first time with his new

rifle stock and hadn't even managed to do any zeroing shots before the competition. Keith was shooting his sons Savage as his own rifle probably wouldn't have hit the board let alone the black.



If it looks like Erhard has a low score please consider that he was using a .303 No 4 rifle with open sights and no spotting scope! I couldn't even see the black let alone hit it without a scope!



Jim kept up club tradition by being beaten by Phil who had borrowed his rifle.

The small-bore element was shot on the 12 October with weather kind again in that it didn't rain but the mist was hovering around the target area.



Some members shot who hadn't competed in the Centre-fire competition and their scores are included in the results.

The competition was shot on the same size targets as the centre-fire element but shot at 50m standing.

Practice 1 is two sighters and ten scoring with no time limit.

Practice 2 is ten rounds in 25 seconds.

Practice 3 is ten exposures of 3 seconds, one shot at each exposure.

Again nobody had all of their shots on the scoring ring with the top three scorers of Phil with 10 on, Jim with 14 and Keith with 15 on.



Jon unfortunately had a jam in one stage so lost eight shots.



Siobhan borrowed Keith's rifle and had a very respectable score, especially as she beat her Dad.



Phil again kept up Club tradition by beating the owner of his borrowed rifle but this time it was Keith.

Jim and Keith are still trying to find a way to get him disqualified, especially as Phil was the winner overall of the Club Championship.

Congratulations to Phil who took a fantastic lead into stage two and hung onto it with a strange rifle he had not shot before. It was more than just adapt and survive – it was adapt and conquer!
