THE WESTERN WINNER

Phil, Jim and Dave had a successful shoot at Frome & District P C 1500 Open competition. All three had personal best scores during the day and came away with prizes.

1500 SB

Jim was going OK until match 4 when he touched the trigger before he should and had a miss, resulting in a below average 1456 for 4th place in X class. However it beat Dave by ONE point who was 3rd in A class. Phil shot a steady 1440 to come 2nd in B class.

1500 CF

Jim made the unforgivable mistake of trying something new during a competition and had two rounds left in the gun in M3. But still came 2nd. Dave was struggling with his knee injury and on two occasions did not get all his shots away in time.

Timed & Precision 1 SB

Jim was reasonably happy with 298 but it only got him 6th place.

Phil had to reshoot his as the target had been put on upside down, then during the reshoot the turners failed and he had another reshoot – so under the circumstances a 295 was not bad and he came 2nd in A class

Timed & Precision 1 CF

300 with 18 is not good enough these days and he came 10th. Dave could not match his performance of the week before and shot a dismal 298/16.

Timed & Precision 1 Classic

Jim and Dave came 2nd & 3rd with 299 and 298 respectively. The guy who won crushed them both with a new British record of 300 with 27 x's!

Timed & Precision2 SB

This was always going to be a PB for Phil (as he had not shot it before) He loved stage one where you fire six shots in five seconds twice. He went on to come 2nd in A class with 561.

Multi-Target SB

Jim was disappointed with his 111 and 5th place in X. Phil did OK with 104 for 2nd place in B class.

Multi-Target CF

Dave shot this first and was over the moon with a PB of 119/19 x's and had a big smile on his face. Jim shot later on and everything went just right – he equaled the British record with 120/21 x's, He was more than happy with that.

Multi-Target Classic

Dave shot another PB of 118/14 but was annoyed that he could have done better as he rushed the last two shots – both 4's.

Jim was 4th with 114/11
